The regular monthly meeting of the Town of Florida Town Board was called to order at 7:23 pm by Deputy Supervisor Steven Rackowski. Communications & Announcements:

- Sandy Mead was present to let the Board know about the change in the cost for insurance.
 CDPHP went up 2.3% with the same benefits and no deductible. No large increase in the vision plan for families.
- NYS has mandated sexual harassment training for all employees. Benetech offers a free webinar
 that takes approximately 30 minutes. This has to be done by October of 2019. A written policy
 also has to be in place at that time. Attorney Slezak will review the general policy that is available
 and make any changes necessary for the Town. All outside vendors that come on to Town
 property have to have proof of sexual harassment training.

- 1. Attorney Slezak read the SEQR and the Town Board members present answered all questions and found a negative declaration.
- 2. **RESOLUTION #66** was sponsored by Councilman Robataille and seconded by Councilman Phillips to set the Public Hearing for the 2019 Town of Florida Budget for Thursday, November 8th at 7:00pm. All in favor and passed.
- 3. **RESOLUTION #67** was sponsored by Councilman Robataille and seconded by Councilman Phillips to award the bid for Town Hall renovations to Borderline Excavation & Fence LLC of St. Johnsville, NY for sum not to exceed two hundred forty-seven thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$247,750). Project will be funded from the General Reserve Fund Balance. All in favor and passed.
- 4. **RESOLUTION #68a** was sponsored by Councilman Robataille and seconded by Councilman Phillips to find a negative declaration for the SEQR read into the minutes in regards to Local Law #4 "Temporary 180 Moratorium on Construction of Solar Energy Systems and Equipment and Solar Energy Facilities in the Town of Florida". All in favor and passed.
- 5. **RESOLUTION #68b** was sponsored by Councilman Phillips and seconded by Councilman Robataille to adopt Local Law #4 "Temporary 180 Day Moratorium on Construction of Solar Energy Systems and Equipment and Solar Energy Facilities in the Town of Florida". All in favor and passed.

Public Comment opened at 8:25pm.

Vijay Puran, 859 Bullshead Road

Spoke about the Town becoming a party to the case regarding the Article 10 from High River Energy. There is money available to assist with engineering studies and attorney fees. The residents who live near the proposed project have all joined and currently there at about 16 people.
